


Project Activities

Networking

Engaging in society is a capacity, however working in an educational setting, such as a school, needs specific methods to make the skill work. Networking is a technique of achieving this. Networking supports us to recognize the institutional setup system and facilitates communication by guiding resources, reducing task duplication, and rapport creation.

To begin the networking process, Saksham Foundation addressed the Panchayat Samiti office, where we spoke with education officers with the goal to gain general acceptance to hold sessions at all schools. Meetings with educational officers are followed by visits to school.





Sessions in School

We conducted a special program designed for adolescents, covering essential topics such as Self-Confidence, Self-Realization, Puberty, Health & Nutrition, Personal Hygiene, Reusable Soaking Pads, Menstrual Hygiene, and General Health Hygiene.

These sessions aimed to help adolescents understand the physical and emotional changes they experience, develop a positive mindset, and adopt healthy habits. Through interactive discussions and practical demonstrations, we educated them on the importance of **menstrual health**, **personal hygiene**, and a nutritious diet. The enthusiastic participation of students highlighted their keen interest in learning and their need for reliable guidance during this crucial stage of life.

This initiative is a significant step toward empowering adolescents with knowledge, awareness, and confidence.

Content of the Sessions and its Detail description

1. Confidence Building:

Confidence-building seminars can help students develop the skills and confidence they need to confront future obstacles. As a result, we held two sessions to boost confidence inside each school. One of the sessions was adapted from a sports activity and discussed how to boost self-confidence by lowering stress. So, the second session was conducted using PowerPoint. The following lessons have been taught:




2. Self-Realization Session

Self-realization is the process of understanding one's strengths and weaknesses, as well as recognizing one's unique mission in life. It's a journey of self-discovery that can result in significant personal growth and transformation. Self-realization advantages are numerous and diverse.



3. Puberty Session with Adolescent

Adolescent education plays an important role for school-aged adolescents because it helps them manage the social and mental challenges of adolescence. Adolescence is the period between childhood and maturity. It is critical to educate children about puberty before they reach puberty in order to keep them safe, thus we conducted instruction sessions with two groups of boys and girls in all schools using Power Points, videos, and question-and-answer sessions on the topic of Puberty. The students responded well





4. Menstrual Hygiene session with Adolescent Girls

The menstrual hygiene session was held to educate schoolgirls on the importance of period health management, address myths about menstruation, and provide them with knowledge to care for their health. The session was part of a larger effort to promote gender equality and enhance health and educational results for schoolgirls.







5. Personal Hygiene Session

We successfully conducted self-hygiene awareness sessions at two schools, engaging with children to promote better health practices.



7. Health Hygiene Session

The health and hygiene session with adolescent girls focused on raising awareness about the importance of personal cleanliness, menstrual hygiene, and overall well-being. The session covered key topics such as daily hygiene routines, hand washing techniques, menstrual hygiene management, and the impact of hygiene on health.







8. Reusable Pads Awareness session & Distribution

We organize reusable pad awareness sessions to provide education on menstrual hygiene and the benefits of reusable pads. Also, we distributed reusable pads to 350 girls.

Environmental impact: Reusable pads can reduce the amount of plastic in waste while also lowering the carbon footprint.

Reusable pads are a hygienic method to control menstruation.

Objectives

Cost: In the long run, reusable pads are less expensive than disposable pads.

Stigma: Reusable pads can assist in relieving the stigma related to using low-quality or throwaway items.

1. Project Introduction Session with Parents

We conducted a **special session for parents** under **NRMAIA Project** to introduce our project on **adolescent health, hygiene, and personal development**. The goal was to help parents understand the changes their children go through during puberty and how they can support them.

In this session, we talked about **self-confidence**, **puberty**, **health and nutrition**, **personal hygiene**, **menstrual hygiene**, **and emotional well-being**. We encouraged parents to have open conversations with their children so they feel comfortable discussing their concerns.

We also explained the importance of **healthy food, mental well-being, and proper hygiene** for growing children. Parents actively participated, asked questions, and appreciated the session. They understood how important it is to talk to their children about these topics at home.

This session helped parents learn how to support their children during adolescence, making sure they grow up healthy, confident, and well-informed.



2. Parents session on adolescence puberty



The session looked for to provide parents with the knowledge and resources they need to help their children during this critical time of development. Physical and emotional transformations, communication strategies, and creating a positive growing environment were among the topics covered. Parents actively engaged and expressed their concerns, resulting in a friendly and collaborative learning environment.






3. Parents Session on Relationship With adolescence

In our parenting sessions, we focused on building solid relationships with adolescents. The goal of these sessions was to help parents and adolescents communicate effectively while also building understanding and trust. The relationship between parents and their children is going to improve as a result.





4. Communication Skills with Adolescents

We organized a special session for parents on how to communicate better with their teenage children. A professional counselor led the session and helped parents understand how to talk in a way that builds trust and support.

The counselor explained that **adolescence** is a time of many changes—both physical and emotional. Many teenagers feel confused and may not share their thoughts with parents.

Diet Supplement Distribution for Three months

To promote health and nutrition among school-aged girls, a diet food distribution program was conducted at PJ Mhatre Highschool & Shri Sadguru Wamanbaba Highschool Ghot, This initiative aimed to address nutritional deficiencies, raise awareness about healthy eating habits, and encourage overall well-being.

Objective

The objective to provide diet food to girls in school to increase hemoglobin (Hb) levels and vitamins B & D is critical to improving general health, particularly addressing nutritional deficiencies that might affect growth, learning, and development.






Post Hemoglobin Test

According to our project, after providing supplementary nutrition to the girls for three months, a post-hemoglobin test was conducted. The results showed an increase in their hemoglobin levels. Following chart is the visual presentation of the impact of the initiatives of the project.





Eco-Friendly Reusable Pad & Tracker Distribution

We successfully conducted a Reusable Pad Distribution and Awareness Session to promote sustainable menstrual hygiene among adolescent girls. The session aimed to educate them on the importance of eco-friendly menstrual products, proper usage, and hygiene maintenance.

Menstruation is a biological symptom that affects women of reproductive age. When Girls engage in the most educational activities, it has an immense effect on their everyday lives and health. Because many Girls struggle in everyday life as a result of premenstrual symptoms and anemia, it is critical to identify, prepare for, and regulate the menstrual cycle early on. So, we designed a tracker to allow the girls to keep track of their cycle.

To support adolescent girls' education and awareness, we organized a drawing activity on menstrual health awareness under NRMAIA project. This initiative aimed to engage the girls in a creative and informative session.



Geometry Box and Personal Hygiene Kit Distribution

A distribution drive was conducted at schools. The initiative provided students with geometry boxes for academic support and personal hygiene kits to promote healthy habits. An awareness session was also conducted to educate students on the importance of maintaining hygiene. This activity helped students gain essential resources while fostering awareness about personal hygiene and self-care.





• Employee Engagement Activity

As part of CSR initiatives, employees were engaged in activities to connect with and support the beneficiaries of the CSR programs. Three employees, including a CSR committee member, visited schools and participated in activities aimed at educating girls on menstrual hygiene and healthy eating habits. A total of 240 students took part in these sessions, gaining valuable knowledge on maintaining good health and hygiene.





EVEREST KANTO CYLINDER ENVIRONMENT CONSERVATION PROGRAMME Highlights of the Year 2024–2025

- Follow Up Visit and Group Meeting: In 2024-25, the Everest Kanto Cylinder Environment Conservation Team covered a total of 454 villages and engaged with 4,449 farmers. Additionally, 1266 farmers were reached through 116 group meetings conducted across 21 villages.
- New Village Selection: The agriculture team identified 57 new villages for the Everest Kanto
 Cylinder Environment Conservation Programme. In this process the team actually explained
 the environment conservation program to 821 farmers. After holding a group meeting of
 farmers, the team selected 21 villages and 300 farmers to plant trees for Everest Kanto Cylinder
 Company.
- World Environment Day: Light of Light Trust, Division Jagruti Environment Conservation Vertical celebrated Word Environment Day on 5th June at Village Borwadi-Kikavi. The LOLT team explained the importance of environment conservation to the farmers. Training was also given on how to plant trees. After that, the LOLT with the farmers planted 20 fruit trees in the village.
- Plant Distribution Training to Team & Farmer: Actually how to do plant distribution as well as arrangement of space for distribution and participation of farmers were given training to Team and farmers.
- **Documentation:** The Environment Conservation team designed thumb sheets and new banners for the plant distribution program.
- Plant distribution: Light of Life Trust, in collaboration with Everest Kanto Cylinder, distributed 6,000 fruit-bearing grafted plants free of cost to 300 farmers across 21 villages in Karjat and Murbad Taluka On 11th and 12th July 2024. Each farmer received 10 mango, 5 cashews, and 5 guava plants. The farmers appreciated this innovative initiative by Light of Life Trust and assured us that they will take good care of these fruit trees by planting them. During the distribution, the team collected the signatures and thumbprints of each farmer.
- Actual Plantation Campaign: Following the distribution of plants to the farmers, the
 agriculture team promptly initiated the actual plantation phase. During this phase, the Executive
 Environment Conservation team visited each farmer's plot to oversee the planting process. The
 team successfully planted 6,000 fruit trees across the plots of 300 farmers in Karjat and Murbad
 taluka.

- Team Overview Meeting: A review meeting was held on August 6, 2024, at the Jagruti Centre. The meeting was attended by all executives involved in environmental conservation. The review focused on the work completed from April to July 2024. Present at the meeting were Gautam Kanoje, Chief Manager Jagruti.
- Adult Literacy: Under the Adult Literacy Programme, the Environment Conservation Team distributed primary books to 44 Adult Literacy farmers in Karjat Tehsil.
- Vandhan Vikas Project: A total of 03 villages and 120 beneficiary farmers were identified and shortlisted for the new forestry Development Project under the Lite of Life Trust and Environmental Conservation Program.
- Farmers' Information Sheet: In September, the Environment Team collected information from 300 farmers of the Everest Kanto Cylinder. This sheet includes various details such as the farmers' ages, Aadhaar card numbers, caste categories, livestock ownership, land holdings, sources of water, and sources of income.
- Capacity Building Training: Capacity building training for the Everest Kanto Cylinder Environment Conservation Team was conducted. During this training, techniques such as ring preparation, soil support, and October heat training were demonstrated in detail, including practical sessions. After completing the training, the environment team promptly began demonstrations with the farmers.
- Government Scheme Linkages: The government has implemented various schemes to provide farmers with agricultural implements and support for establishing orchards. However, many farmers remain unaware of these benefits. The environment team has guided farmers on how to take advantage of these schemes. Notably, initiatives like MGNREGA, Yojanadoot, and Ladki Bahin have benefited 50 farmers across 14 villages.

• Plant Survival Rate Report: The Environment Conservation Team conducted a survey in October and November, entering actual planting data from farmers. During the survey, the team visited the plots and assessed the survival rate of the planted trees.

In Everest Kanto Cylinder, farmers were provided with 20 trees each: 10 mango, 5 cashew, and 5 guava trees. The results are very promising, showing a high survival rate:

- 12 Module Farmers Group Training: The 12-model main training for two villages was completed in December. The villages included in this training were Lakudpada, and Sakharwadi, covering a total of 24 farmers. Topics such as plant Ring Preparation, Shade for plants, and Mulching Training were taught during the sessions. Farmers were first guided through presentations and videos, followed by practical demonstrations conducted on their plots. These trained farmers are now guiding other farmers in their communities.
- Exposure Visit at Kisan International Agriculture Exhibition: On13 December 2024, the Environment Conservation team successfully completed an exposure visit to the Kisan International Agriculture Exhibition Moshi in Pune. During the exhibition, farmers received detailed information about various tools and resources essential for farming, including tractors, fertilizers, seeds, medicines, and more. Of particular interest were innovative technologies such as solar units and solar pumps, which can help address the challenges posed by increasing load shedding. This exposure visit proved to be highly beneficial for the farmers, equipping them with valuable knowledge to improve their agricultural practices.
- VIJAYBHOOMI University (SIP) : The Social Immersion Program (SIP) with Light of Life Trust commenced with thirteen students from Vijay Bhoomi University for a seven-day initiative, from 26th December 2024 to 2nd January 2025. In this program, seven students are engaged in the Environment Conservation vertical, while the other six are working under the Livelihood vertical. In the three villages covered under the Environment Conservation vertical, the students actively participated in activities such as waste management, water management, traditional food processing, organic fertilizer preparation, and pest management.
- AI Universal University SMART Program: As part of the SMART Program, 60 students surveyed six villages on sewage, waste, pest, and organic farming practices. Using the Kobo app,

they visited farms, guided farmers, and suggested solutions to improve productivity under the Everest Kamto Cylinder Environment Conservation Program.

- AI Session Mumbai, Bandra: The AI session was organized on January 23, 2025, in Bandra
 in association with Light of Life Trust and Siraj Kanga, USA. In this session, Mr. Shiraz Kanga
 from America conducted the training. He explained Four GPTs and other important topics in
 detail.
- Agriculture-Allied Business Session & Agriculture Orientation: A session on Agriculture-Allied Business and an orientation on agriculture were conducted for 28 students at Kashale Livelihood Training Center on January 8, 2025. This session provided information on plant nurseries, vegetable cultivation, and medicinal plants.
- MAHA DBT Gov. Schemes Session: The government scheme session for farmers was conducted through the Light of Life Trust and Environment Conservation. Information was given about various government schemes like MNREGA for farmers, PM Kisan, PM Awas Yojana etc. and how to register them on the portal on Maha. DBT. Mr. Rajesh Bhoir Sir, Head of Computer, Light of Life Trust, Jagriti Centre was present as the chief guide.
- Farmers Exposure Visit: -46 women visited the Light of Life Trust's Jeevan Asha Centre in Tiware, exploring demo plots and skill centres. They learned about fruit tree care, harvesting, and women-focused business skills. The visit inspired a strong interest in agricultural and livelihood development.
- Plantation Lay-Out Training to Team and Farmers: First the agriculture team was trained to lay out the plantation. In the training, farmers were taught practically how to plant trees according to the size of their plots. After that, the agriculture team conducted group meetings in 10 villages and imparted plantation training to the farmers. Also, by going to the fields of the selected farmers in the village, the plots of the farmers were drawn with the help of line rope and marking powder.

Photography & Videography Workshop

Light of Life Trust held a workshop at the Jeevan Asha Centre in Tiware, where participants learned photo and video techniques, including angles, types, and styles. Training was led by experts Ashok Vishwas and Aniket Kasture from Mumbai.

Women's Day Celebration

On March 8, Light of Life Trust celebrated Women's Day at its Tiware Centre. A bike rally by 40 women from Mumbai's LRSC Riding Group raised awareness across Karjat. The event featured rangoli on women's rights, tree plantation, and inspiring speeches by Trust leaders, promoting empowerment and environmental awareness.

• Village Representative: The Environment Team formed 21 Village Representative Committees in 21 villages of Everest Kanto Cylinder. Coordination among farmers is crucial for addressing farm-related issues. The Village Representative Committee plays a significant role in assisting the Light of Life Trust in various activities such as organizing training sessions, bidding farewell to departing farmers, arranging group meetings, and addressing environmental concerns.

• Farmer Training: -

- Plant Steaking Training: After the plantation was completed, the farmers were trained in staking training to prevent damage to the plants due to strong winds. By supporting the saplings with wooden sticks, the plant does not move and water does not enter the trunk. After successful completion of this process the plants are able to survive.
- Water Drain Training: If rainwater accumulates near the base of the plant, the roots of the plant may rot and the sapling may die. Hence water drain training is given to the farmers. In this, the farmers remove the water around the saplings with the help of shovels.
- O Soil Support Training: Konkan division receives a lot of rain. This heavy rain causes erosion of the soil around the plants. For that, the plant needs to add soil support. For this, the environment team trained the farmers to support the soil to the trees.
- Grass Cleaning: Grass cleaning training played a crucial role in this effort. During this training, the team instructed farmers on how to properly clear grass from around the base of the trees. Following the training, farmers began to independently manage the grass cleaning process.
- Ring Preparation for Water: As the rain ceases in September, and October brings increasing heat, the Environment team provided comprehensive training to the farmers on creating rings and watering the trees. The formation of tree rings indicates the age and growth conditions of the tree. When sudden rainwater collects in the ring, it can create a microhabitat that retains moisture. This moisture can lead to increased humidity around the base of the tree, promoting dew formation.
- October Head Training: After the monsoon season, a sudden surge of heat occurs in October. This intense heat leads to significant evaporation, adversely affecting plants. To combat this issue, the Light of Life Trust has developed various training programs aimed at protecting plants from the heat. As a result of these efforts, plants are better shielded from high temperatures, promoting healthier growth. These trainings are as follows.

- Irrigation Training: There are various methods for watering plants, especially when water is scarce. Training covers how to effectively water plants using waste materials, such as Bisleri bottles or saline bottles. Additionally, farmers receive guidance on techniques for delivering water directly to the soil. With this training, farmers are able to care for their trees more effectively, which also encourages other farmers to engage in planting initiatives.
- Mulching Training: A layer of grass mulch is placed around the graft to protect its roots from intense heat and to reduce evaporation of the supplied water. This practice, known as plant mulching, is particularly beneficial in October and November. By mulching, both the graft and its roots are shielded from the scorching temperatures. This creates a cooler environment at the root level, allowing the grafts to grow vigorously.
- O Water Storage Activity:- Farmers were trained to dig 4x4x4 ft plastic-lined pits to store rainwater during the monsoon. This stored water supports farming for 2–3 months post-monsoon, helping with sustainable water management.
- Preventing Wildfires in Farmlands:- To protect orchards from wildfires during dry months, farmers clear a 12-foot grass belt around their fields and burn the removed grass in a controlled manner, preventing fire from spreading into their farms.
- o Natural Remedies for Fruit Tree Pests:-Farmers were trained to use natural pest control methods like tobacco, neem, and pepper sprays, and plants like Pedilanthus to prevent termite attacks—promoting sustainable, chemical-free farming.

Bordo Paste Training

- 242 farmers from 21 villages were trained by Light of Life Trust and Everest Kanto Cylinder to use Bordo paste on fruit trees. This copper-based paste protects trees from fungal infections and sun damage, especially after pruning. It is applied twice a year—before and after the monsoon—for healthy tree growth.
- PVC Pond Preparation Training: To tackle summer water shortages, farmers were trained to create PVC ponds by lining 5x6x6 ft pits with plastic for water storage. This helps meet plant water needs efficiently and reduces the burden of fetching water from distant sources.
- Organic Insecticides Training: Farmers are being trained on the properties of Neem Leaves, Tobacco, and PEDILANTHUS plants for the production of organic insecticide spray. Since these plants are readily available to farmers at no cost, they derive significant benefits, ensuring the organic status of their fruit trees.

- Heavy Rain Maintenance: Heavy rains have commenced in Konkan, necessitating heavy rain maintenance. This maintenance involves the removal of accumulated water around the trees and providing firm soil support to them.
- o Caring for Blossom of Fruit Trees:-Farmers were trained to remove flowers from young grafted fruit trees for the first three years to ensure healthy plant growth. Early fruiting can weaken or kill the plant, making flower removal essential for long-term productivity.
- FertigationTo reduce costs, farmers were trained to make compost from dry leaves and waste grass. Using this organic fertilizer improves fruit tree growth and quality, offering a low-cost, effective alternative to market-bought fertilizers.
- O Spraying: Farmers were trained to use organic sprays to protect new tree growth from pests. The training covered timing, techniques, and selecting natural remedies to ensure healthy plant development.
- Plant Data Entry: After completing the Actual Plantation Campaign, the Environment Team began processing the plant data entry. In the month of October-November, the team conducted data entry for a total of 300 farmers across 21 villages.
- 2024 Area Under Plantation: It's great to hear that 50.125 acres of land were covered this year under the initiative involving 300 farmers associated with Everest Kanto Cylinder Environment Conservation Program. Planting fruit trees on hill slopes can significantly aid in preventing soil erosion due to the trees' root systems that help bind the soil.
- Next Year Planning Meeting :- A meeting was convened with the agriculture team to devise a new strategy for Everest Kanto Cylinder Environment Conservation Environment Conservation 2024-25. During this session, discussions revolved around identifying new villages and determining the number of new beneficiaries. Plans were also made regarding follow-up and monitoring visits to farmers' plots from the previous year
- Annual Templates: The Everest Kanto Cylinder Environment Conservation Program
 comprises various activities to be conducted over a twelve-month period. A meeting was
 convened with the team to discuss these activities and identify any new ones that need to be
 added. Following this meeting, the team developed their own annual template. Working
 throughout the year has become more convenient with the assistance of this annual template.

- Google Sheet for weekly and monthly reports: Created an online Google Sheet for weekly and monthly reports and distributed it to the team. Additionally, training sessions were conducted to instruct the members of the conservation team on how to fill out these online Google Sheets.
- Appraisal Year 2024-25: A review of the annual operations for the years 2024-25 was held on 14 and 18 February 2025 under the Light of Life Trust, Environment Conservation Programme. It accounted for the performance done during the year with the PMS sheet, Annual Plan, tracking sheet, Report chart and Other any annual activity Conducted and complete during this year. On this occasion, the Environment Conservation Officer, Mr. Kanhaiya Somane, was present.
- Reports & Documentation.
 - o Prepared weekly & monthly reports of Environment Conservation Program.
 - o Prepared quarterly of Environment Conservation Program.
 - o Prepared Accounting & Vouchers.
- Environment Conservation Program—with the support of Everest Kanto Cylinder: Team successfully completed 300 Farmers in 21 Villages and 6000 Plant distribution for the year of 2024-25 under Environment Conservation Program.

He also planted 30 more trees at his own expense. Through training from agricultural assistants, he efficiently manages watering, fertilizing, and pesticide spraying for his trees.

In summer, he uses water from a borewell to irrigate his trees, ensuring their growth. Additionally, he planted basil on a 6-guntha plot as a side business, which is sold in Dadar, Mumbai, for medicinal use. This generates an income of 40,000 to 50,000 rupees annually.





- Placement: Out of the 22 certified, 16 have been placed, which is around 72%.










Question-wise performance – Artificial Intelligence




